# Easy Clean Coatings Care Instructions

## **EnduroShield Protection**

EnduroShield acts as an invisible shield, bonding to your glass to help protect against dirt, grime, and soap scum. It repels both water, making surfaces easy to clean while preserving their appearance. With EnduroShield, your cleaning time will be reduced and the surface will be easier to clean. Please follow the below steps to maintain your protected surfaces.



### **Shower Glass**

#### Daily Care (Just a Few Seconds)

Squeegee or Dry: After each use, wipe the glass with a squeegee or dry it with a microfiber cloth to remove water drops. This helps prevent mineral spots and keeps the glass cleaner longer.

### Weekly and As-Needed Cleaning (Just a Few Minutes)

Mild Soap Solution: Clean once a week or as needed with a microfiber cloth dampened with white vinegar and a drop of mild, non-abrasive liquid soap (like dish soap). Rinse and dry thoroughly.

### For Mineral Buildup or Soap Scum

*Light Buildup:* Spray undiluted white vinegar on the glass, let it sit for a few minutes, then wipe with a microfiber cloth. Repeat as needed.

*Heavy Buildup:* Dampen a Magic Eraser with vinegar or CLR (Calcium Lime Rust remover) and gently scrub the area. Rinse and dry. Repeat if necessary.

#### **Pro Tips**

*Haze Removal:* If the glass appears hazy after installation, wipe it with an alcohol (like rubbing, denatured, or isopropanol), then rinse with clear water and dry. This will remove the haze.

*Best Results:* For best results, wipe down the glass after each use with a good-quality squeegee. This will reduce mineral spotting and keep the glass cleaner between cleans.

# Interior Glass (Excluding Shower Glass)

*Mild Soap Solution:* Clean as needed with a microfiber cloth dampened with white vinegar and a drop of mild, non-abrasive liquid soap. Rinse and dry thoroughly.

*For Mineral Buildup:* Use undiluted white vinegar on a microfiber cloth to gently rub the glass. Repeat if needed. For heavier buildup, use a Magic Eraser dampened with CLR (Calcium Lime Rust remover).

### **Pro Tips**

*Haze Removal:* If the glass appears hazy after installation, wipe it with an alcohol (like rubbing, denatured, or isopropanol), then rinse with clear water and dry. This will remove the haze.

*Professional Cleaners:* Provide them with these instructions to ensure they follow the correct procedures and maintain your warranty.

### **Exterior Glass**

Clean as needed with a mild detergent and water using a t-bar mop assembly and squeegee. For light buildup, wipe down the glass with a microfiber cloth dampened with white vinegar and a drop of non-abrasive liquid soap (hand, body, or dish). Rinse and dry.

### **Pro Tips**

*Haze Removal:* If the glass appears hazy after installation, wipe it with an alcohol (like rubbing, denatured, or isopropanol), then rinse with clear water and dry. This will remove the haze.

*Best Results:* Clean the glass when covered with shade to prevent streaking. In areas prone to salt build-up or dust build-up, rinse off excess contaminants with fresh water before cleaning.

*Professional Cleaners:* Provide them with these instructions to ensure they follow the correct procedures and maintain your warranty.

## Tile & Grout

Clean shower tiles and grout each week. Other tiles such as backsplashes and floor tiles can be cleaned as required. Use diluted white vinegar and/or a mild detergent with a damp microfiber cloth to remove soap scum and grime from the tiled surface.

# **Stainless Steel & Chrome**

General cleaning of interior stainless steel and chrome treated surfaces can be done with warm water and a microfiber cloth, then allowed to dry. For tougher stains, use a mild detergent or an all-purpose spray-on cleaner, then buff dry. Exterior surfaces should be cleaned with warm soapy water and a microfiber cloth, then rinsed with fresh water. For best results, rub in the direction of the grain.









# **Care Instructions**



## What to Avoid

Note: These may damage the treatment and void any warranty.

- Abrasives including water spot removers, toothpaste, polishes, Norwex Cloths, rough, or gritty substances.
- Acids or Alkalis that you would not want in contact with your skin for an extended period of time.
- Cleaners that include Sodium hypochlorite (NaOCl), bleach, Tilex, or anything with sodium hydroxide should not be used on your shower glass.
- Harsh or chemical cleaners. With correct maintenance, these are not required.

# **Acceptable Cleaning Products**

While all that should be needed to keep the glass looking clean are a squeegee, good quality mild liquid soap, and white vinegar, occasionally we are asked to recommend specific products. Some major brand cleaners are listed below, but keep in mind they should not be necessary, and often have very limited benefits in removing either soap or mineral buildup.

- EnduroClean
- Windex® (Standard, vinegar, alcohol, ammonia)
- SprayWay® (or other alcohol-based foaming cleaners)
- 7th Generation®, Dawn® (or other mild eco-friendly cleaners)
- CLR® (Calcium Lime Rust)
- Mild liquid soaps (like Dawn, Mrs. Meyers)

It should be noted that with any cleaner used on the EnduroShield surface, a thorough rinse with clean water should follow immediately. Although these cleaners can be used instead of the suggested maintenance, EnduroShield is designed to be an 'easy clean coating' that requires only vinegar and/or a mild detergent that does not contain harsh or toxic chemicals to maintain the surface effectively.

# Approved Squeegees

We recommend the EnduroShield Professional Squeegee, Oxo Good Grips, Ettore, or Pulux branded squeegees due to the high-quality rubber blade.
